

Sundhed.dk is the official portal for the public Danish Healthcare Services and enables citizens and healthcare professionals to find information and communicate











# The 2007-structural reform as basis for historical hospital investments

From 14 counties to 5 regions required a reconsideration of hospital structure

# Planning guidelines/directives from the National Health Authority (after the 2007-reform, the National Health

Authority had a stronger position)



A new model for organization of hospitals with acute admission (24/7)

+40 billion DDK (+ 5 billion CHF) for new/renovated hospitals

Introduced a new model for organization of acute/emergency admission (24/7)

A common hospital acute/emergensy admission facility across specialities

Beds reallocated from the specialized wards

Ideally acutely admitted patients are always seen by specialists

Patients stay a max of 48 hours in the acute admission ward before being discharged or admitted to a specialized ward.

App. 70% are discharged within 24 hours

The allocation of investment funds



### **June 2007**

The annual budget agreement between central government and the five regions

Establishe a 5 person expert panel to advice government on hospital investment proposals from the regions

- 3 Danes
- 2 Scandinavians



August 2007

Government Fund' - 25 billion Dkr. over 10 years for hospital investments + 15 billion from the regions: A total of +40 billions DKK (5 billions CHF)



- Hospital in neighboring city closed







Hospitals with acute admission 2024






## What happened to the non-acute admissson hospitals

**Closed:** black dot; **changed**: red dot – still significant hospital and small pink dot (marginal)

• 17 were closed

In practice more hospitals were closed (they were already in 'the death throes')
